

PROJECT LIV-SPÅRET

**Swedish language training
and introduction to health
and medical care or dental care**



The third group in the Liv-spåret project.

Project Liv-spåret is for new arrivals with health or dental care training within registered professions from outside the EU or EEA. We offer Swedish language training combined with other activities. The project will support you on your route to Swedish professional registration. It will improve your opportunities for working in health and medical care or in dental care.

CONTENT

- Swedish language training, specialising in health and medical care.
- Study visits and placements within the county council's operations.
- Practical training at the county council's clinical training centre or at a dental clinic.

Intake for the project is planned to take place twice a year. Applicants will be selected through matching against the county council's staffing needs.

APPLICANTS SHOULD:

- Have a professional qualification within health and medical care or dental care from outside the EU/EEA.
- Knowledge of the Swedish language, equivalent to Swedish for Immigrants D (SFI D).
- Be registered with Arbetsförmedlingen.

The activities in the Liv-spåret project are divided into **FOUR STAGES** over a period of approximately one year.

STAGE 1

You start with an introduction and study Swedish with a focus on health care or medical care at Korta vägen – The short route – at Folkuniversitetet.

While you are studying Swedish, several study visits are arranged to the county council's departments and courses are organised at the county council's clinical training centre.

STAGE 2

You continue with the Swedish language course at Korta vägen. At the same time you get practical experience as an intern in one of the county council's departments. This internship has its focus on language skills and gives you an insight into Swedish health and medical care and dental care. You will also receive training at the county council's clinical training centre. For dental practitioners the activities may seem a bit strange at the county council's clinical training centre.

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STAGE 3

Swedish language instruction continues at Korta vägen while you work as an intern at one of the county council's departments. This internship focuses on language training but there is also scope for practical training. Courses and lectures are held at the county council's clinical training centre, among other places. For dental practitioners the activities may seem a bit strange at the county council's clinical training centre.

STAGE 4

Course in Swedish laws and regulations and applying for the introductory course for the National Board of Health and Welfare (Socialstyrelsen) proficiency test. For dental practitioners, the public dental service arranges a study group prior to the National Board's test. The decision on the granting of a Swedish professional licence is taken by the National Board of Health and Welfare.

ABOUT VÄRMLAND COUNTY COUNCIL

Värmland county council works with health and medical care and dental care. With just over 8,000 employees we are one of the county's biggest employers and knowledge organisations. There are approximately 30 health centres in the county, and hospitals in Arvika, Karlstad and Torsby. The dental service has approximately 22 general dental care clinics in the county and 8 specialist clinics.
